

## The Catastrophe of Sin

12—The Trials of a King

**Key Verse:** 2 Samuel 12:13a *Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD."*

**Big Idea:** The story of David's catastrophic sin of adultery with Bathsheba and murder of Uriah in 2 Samuel 11-12 illustrates the all-too-familiar cycle of temptation, sin, confession and restoration.

**I. We find a c\_\_\_\_\_ where sin seems predictable 11:1-2**

**II. We allow ourselves to c\_\_\_\_\_ into sin**

Note David's 3 downward steps into sin

- 1) David i\_\_\_\_\_ when he should have covered his eyes 2  
*Job 31:1*
- 2) David i\_\_\_\_\_ when he should have curbed his curiosity 3  
*1 Corinthians 10:13*
- 3) David i\_\_\_\_\_ when he should have refrained 4-5  
*James 1:13-15; Matthew 5:29-30*

**III. We make outrageous attempts to c\_\_\_\_\_ -up sin**

David's 3 unsuccessful attempts 6-9; 12-13; 14-17

**IV. God caringly c\_\_\_\_\_ & corrects our sin: conviction 12:1-5**

*2 Peter 3:9*

**V. God invites us to c\_\_\_\_\_ & receive forgiveness for our sin 13**

**VI. We still must face the c\_\_\_\_\_ of our sin 10-11 & 14**

**VII. God has promised to c\_\_\_\_\_ us from our sin**

*1 John 1:9; Psalm 51 (See also Psalm 32:1-5); John 16:8-11*

David's 3 unsuccessful attempts 6-9; 12-13; 14-17

**IV. God caringly c\_\_\_\_\_ & corrects our sin: conviction 12:1-5**

*2 Peter 3:9*

**V. God invites us to c\_\_\_\_\_ & receive forgiveness for our sin 13**

**VI. We still must face the c\_\_\_\_\_ of our sin 10-11 & 14**

**VII. God has promised to c\_\_\_\_\_ us from our sin**

*1 John 1:9; Psalm 51 (See also Psalm 32:1-5); John 16:8-11*
